ORDINANCE NUMBER 109

Introduced by E.N. Stoughton

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING CERTAIN PUBLIC OFFENCES AND PROVIDING
PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE SAME.

It shall be unlawful for the owner or driver of teams or single animals to obstruct the crossings of streets or alleys of the City of Polson by halting or hitching such team or teams, animal or animals across the same, or for any person or persons within the said City of Polson to deposit, store or leave wagons, implements, sleighs, machinery, lumber or wood at and along the street or streets of the City of Polson that may obstruct or hinder the free and unlimited travel of the public, either on foot or with team or teams or other means of transportation. It is hereby made the duty of the Street Commissioner and the Chief of Police and Policemen to see that the provisions of this section are enforced, and after notice and proper request to any person so obstructing the street or streets, alley or alleys to remove such team or single animal, or such obstruction, and if such person shall continue to so obstruct the street or alley, he shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor and a conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars.

The passage of this ordinance being deemed immediately necessary for peace, health and safety to the City of Polson and the inhabitants thereof, it is hereby declared to be "An Emergency Measure" and to become immediately effective from and after its passage and approval.

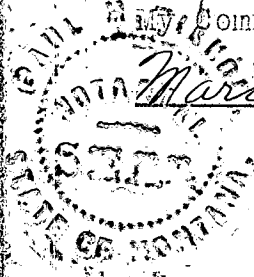

ORDINANCE NO. 110

AN ORDINANCE DESCRIBING CERTAIN NUISANCES AND PENALTIES, RELATING TO NOXIOUS WEEDS AND THE ABATEMENT OF NUISANCES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POLSON:

KEEPING ANIMALS

Section 1. Any one who shall, within the limits of the City of Polson, keep or maintain any pen, enclosure, stable or building for ~~some~~ horses, cattle or other animals, in such a filthy condition as to be offensive to neighbors or passers-by, or injurious to the health of the neighborhood, shall be deemed guilty of maintaining a nuisance, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars; and the continuance of the same, for every day after being notified by any city officer to abate the same shall be regarded as a separate offense to be punished by a like fine.

PRIVIES AND DRAINS

Section 2. If any person shall suffer any cellar, vault, private drain, pool, privy, sewer or ground upon any premises belonging to or occupied by him or her to become a nuisance, foul, offensive or injurious to public health, or offensive or injurious to any person, such person shall be deemed guilty of maintaining a nuisance, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars; and the continuance of the same for every day after due notice by the city authorities to abate the same shall be deemed a separate offense, punishable with like fine.

DEAD ANIMALS

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the owner of any animal dying within the city limits, forthwith, or with all reasonable
