ORDINANCE No. 140

Introduced by A. M. Davidson.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION ON THE QUESTION WHETHER OR NOT THE INDEBTEDNESS OF THE CITY OF POLSON MONTANA SHALL BE INCREASED OVER AND ABOVE THE THREE PER CENT LIMIT FIXED BY LAW BY THE ISSUANCE OF WATER BONDS TO THE AMOUNT OF FORTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS TO BE USED FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROCURING A PURE, ADEQUATE AND WHOLESOME SUPPLY OF WATER FOR SAID CITY FROM BIG CREEK COMMONLY KNOWN AS HELL ROARING CREEK. SAID CITY SHALL OWN AND CONTROL SAID WATER AND DEVOTE THE REVENUE DERIVED THEREFROM TO THE PAYMENT OF THE DEBT INCURRED THEREFOR/

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Polson.

Section 1. That it is necessary and desirable and deemed for the best interest of the city of Polson by the city council that said city procure the water of Big Creek and build a pipe line from said Big Creek to said city for the purpose of conveying said water. That said city shall own and control the same and devote the revenue derived therefrom to the payment of the indebtedness incurred therefor.

Section 2. That a special election be held in the city of Polson, Montana on the twentieth day of February, 1922 for the purpose of ascertaining the will of the taxpayers to be affected thereby, and that authority be given and power conferred on the city council of said city to increase the indebtedness of said city over and above the three per cent limit fixed by law by the issuance of water bonds of said city to the amount of Forty-five Thousand Dollars for the purpose of constructing a pipe line to bring the said water of Big Creek into said city; which water system, when constructed, the city shall own and control and the revenue derived therefrom shall be devoted to the payment of the indebtedness incurred therefor.

Section 3. That the time and place of holding said election shall be as follows:- At the city of Polson, State of Montana, on the 20th day of February, 1922 from 8 o'clock A.M. to 6 o'clock P.M. on said day. That the voting places for said election shall be:-

First Ward, Lambeth Building on 3rd St. in Block 11.

Second Ward, City Hall on 4th St. Block 18.

Third Ward, in Hatch Building, on Lot 1 Block 30.

That said bonds proposed to be issued shall be for forty-five thousand dollars; that said bonds shall be forty-five in number and numbered from one to forty-five both inclusive; that said bonds shall be designated water bonds and shall be of the denomination of One Thousand Dollars each and the principal shall be payable in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard weight and fineness; said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semiannually and shall be dated the first day of May, 1922 and shall be redeemable and payable as follows:-

Ten Thousand Dollars of said bonds, numbered from one to ten, both inclusive, shall be redeemable on and after the first day of May, 1927 and shall be paid on the first day of May, 1942.

Ten Thousand Dollars of said bonds, numbered from eleven to twenty, both inclusive shall be redeemable on and after the first day of May, 1932 and shall be paid on the first day of May, 1942.

And Twenty-five Thousand Dollars of said bonds, numbered from twenty-one to forty-five, both inclusive, shall be redeemable on the first day of May, 1937 and shall be payable on the first day of May, 1942.

There shall be semi-annual interest coupons attached to said bonds, interest payable semi-annually in lawful money of the United States of America. The coupons and bonds shall be in such form as the council by ordinance directs.

A tax to be fixed by ordinance must be levied each year for the purpose of paying interest on bonds and to create a sinking fund for their redemption.

Whenever, at any time, after such bonds become redeemable the sum in the sinking fund equals or exceeds One Thousand Dollars, the city treasurer may redeem such amount of the bonds which may be redeemable or payable, according to law.

Section 4. The ballot used in such election shall be of ordinary white paper four inches by six inches in size and shall be printed in the following form:-

"The proposition to increase the indebtedness of the city of Polson, Montana over and above the three per cent limit fixed by law by the issuance of water bonds of said city to the amount of Forty-five Thousand Dollars for the purpose of constructing a pipe line to convey the waters of Big Creek to said city of Polson; which water the city shall own and control and devote the revenue therefrom to the payment of the debt incurred therefor.

Notice is hereby given that a special election shall be held in the city of Polson, Montana on the 20th day of February, 1922, The polls shall be open from 8 o'clock A.M. to 6 o'clock P.M. on said day for the purpose of submitting to the tax payers of said city qualified to vote thereon the question of whether or not said city of Polson shall increase its indebtedness over and above the three per cent limit fixed by law by the issuance of water bonds of said city to the amount of Forty-five Thousand Dollars for the purpose of procuring for said city an adequate and wholesome water supply from the waters of Big Creek, commonly known as Hell Roaring Creek. Said city shall own and control said water system and devote the revenue derived therefrom to the payment of the indebtedness incurred therefor. The character of said bonds is water bonds. The amount and character of the bonds proposed to be issued shall be Forty-five Thousand Dollars. That said bonds shall be forty-five in number and their numbers from one to forty-five, both inclusive. Said bonds shall be designated water bonds and shall be in denominations of One Thousand Dollars each and the principal shall be payable in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard weight and fineness. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and shall be dated the first day of May, 1922 and shall be redeemable and payable as follows:-

Ten Thousand Dollars of said bonds, numbered from one to ten both inclusive, shall be redeemable on or after the first day of May, 1927, and shall be paid on or before the first day of May, 1942.

Ten Thousand Dollars of said bonds, numbered from eleven to twenty, both inclusive, shall be redeemable on and after the first day of May, 1922 and shall be paid on or before the first day of May, 1942.

And Twenty-five Thousand Dollars of said bonds, numbered from Twenty-one to Forty-five, both inclusive, shall be redeemable on the first day of May, 1937, and shall be paid on the first day of May, 1942.

There shall be semi annual interest coupons attached to said bonds, payable semi-annually in lawful money of the United States of America.

The coupons and bonds shall be in such form as the council by ordinance directs. A tax to be fixed by ordinance must be levied each year for the purpose of paying interest due on the bonds and to create a sinking fund for their redemption. Whenever at any time after such bonds become redeemable the sum in the sinking fund equals or exceeds one thousand dollars the City Treasurer may redeem such amount of the bonds which may then be payable or redeemable according to law.

Places of voting in each ward or precinct is as follows:-

Second Ward, City Hall, Fourth Street, Block 18.

Third Ward in Hatch Building, on Lot 1 Block 30.

ORDINANCE NO. 140.

Introduced by A. M. Davidson.

An ordinance providing for the holding of a special election on the question of whether or not the indebtedness of the City of Polson, Montana, shall be increased over and above the three per cent limit fixed by law by the issuance of Water Bonds to the amount of Forty-five Thousand Dollars to be used for the purpose of procuring a pure, adequate and wholesome supply of water for said city from Big Creek, commonly known as Hell Roaring Creek. Said City shall own and control said water and devote the revenue derived therefrom to the payment of the debt incurred therefor.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Polson:

Section 1. That it is necessary and desirable and deemed for the best interest of the City of Polson by the City Council that said city procure the waters of Big Creek and build a pipe line from said Big Creek to said city for the purpose of conveying said water. That said city shall own and control the same and devote the revenue derived therefrom to the payment of the indebtedness incurred therefor.

Section 2. That a special election be held in the City of Polson, Montana, on the 20th day of February, 1922, for the purpose of ascertaining the will of the taxpayers to be affected thereby, and that authority be given and power conferred on the city council of said city to increase the indebtedness of said city over and above the three per cent limit fixed by law by the issuance of water bonds of said city to the amount of Forty-five Thousand Dollars for the purpose of constructing a pipe line to bring the said waters of Big Creek into said city; which water system, when constructed, the city shall own and control, and the revenue derived therefrom shall be devoted to the payment of the indebtedness incurred therefor.
