## ORDINANCE No. 153

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE No. 34. RELATING TO VAGRANTS.

Over the party

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Polson, Montana.

Section 1. Every person (except Indians who are wards of the Government) without visible means of living, who has the physical ability to work, and who does not seek employment or labor when employment is offered to him; every healthy beggar who solicits alms as a business; every person who roams about from place to place without any lawful business; every idle and dissolute person or associate of known thieves, who wanders about the streets at late or unusual hours of the night, or who lodges in any barn, shed, outhouse, vessel or other place other than such as is kept for lodging purposes without the permission of the owner or person entitled to the possession thereof; every lewd and dissolute person who lives in and about houses of ill fame or who lives with or upon the earnings of women of had repute; every common prostitute and common drunkard; every lewd and dissolute female person known as a street walker or common prostitute who shall, upon the public streets or in and about any public place or assembly or in any saloon, barroom, club room or any other public or general place or resort for men, or any where within the sight or hearing of women and children, conduct or behave herself in an immodest, drunken, profane or obscene manner, either by action, language or improper exposure of her person; every common drunkard who is in the habit of lying around the streets, alleys, sidewalks, saloons, barrooms or other places in a state of gross intoxication, shall be deemed a vagrant and upon conviction thereof shall be punished as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. Every person convicted of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined in any sum not exceeding One Hundred Dollars, together with costs of suit.

Section 3. WHEREAS, an emergency exists and it is immediately necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Polson, this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval according to law.
