

## Ordinance No. 169

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND FIXING HOURS FOR THE CONDUCT OF POOL ROOMS, CARD ROOMS, BILLIARD ROOMS, SOFT DRINK PARLORS AND PLACES WHERE BEER IS SOLD, AND FIXING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POLSON:

Section 1. That no place of business wherein soft drinks or beer are sold, except drug stores, or wherein a pool room, card room or billiard room is conducted shall remain open or be opened after the hour of two o'clock A. M. on any day and prior to the hour of seven o'clock A. M. of the same day, except on Sunday when the same shall not open prior to the hour of eleven o'clock A. M. of the same Sunday.

Section 2. That any owner or person in charge of any of the places of business mentioned in the preceding section, who violates the provisions of the preceding section, shall be guilty of the offence of conducting business unlawfully, a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment of not to exceed thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to and does exist.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
