## ORDINANCE NO. 198

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION-3829 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES. OF THE CITY OF POLSON? MONTANA, NO. 191, RELATING TO PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OFPOESON, MONTANA:

Section 1. That Section 529 of the revised Ordinances of the City of Polson, Montana, No. 191, be, and the same is hereby, amended to read as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person to park any automobile, or moter vehicle of any kind, upon "B" Street in front of the property and building occupied by and known as the United States Post Office, for a period of over fifteen minutes at any one time; and it shall be unlawful for any person to to park any automobile, or othermotor vehicle of any kind, upon "B" Street between Third and Fourth Streets, or upon Third Street between "B" and "G" Streets for a period of more than two and one-half hours at any one time; and it shall be unlawful for any person to park any automobile, ormotor vehicle of any kind, upon any of the the others streets, alleys or public grounds in the city of Polson, for a period of tow and one-half hours at any one time, when and where signs, posters or markers so direct or indicate; and it shall be unlawful for any person to park any automobile, or motor vehicle of any kind, upon any of the streets, alleys or public grounds in the City of Polson, for a period of over twelve hours at any one time.

Section 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, ware hereby repealed.

Section 3. The Council nereby declares that an emergency exists and therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage and approval.
