Section 8. Conflicting Ordinances, Orders, Rules and Regulations
Suspended. At all times when the orders, rules and regulations made and promulgated pursuant to this ordinance shall be in effect, they shall superced all existing ordinances, orders, rules and regulations insofar as the latter may be inclossistant therewith.

Section 9. No Conflict With State or Federal Statutes. This ordinance shall not be construed so as to conflict with any State or Federal statute or with any military or naval order; rule or regulation.

Section 10. Penalties for Violations. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance or anyorder, rule or regulation knews issued pursuant thereto shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) or imprisonment for not more than Ninety (90) days.

Section 11: Seperability of Provisions. It is the intention of the City Council that each seperate provision of this ordinanceshall be deemed independent of all other provisions herein, and it is further the intention of the city council that it a provision of this ordinance be declared to be invalid, all other provisions thereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

Section 12. Finding of Emergency. This ordinance ispassed as an emergency measure, and the council does by the vote by which this ordinance is passed, hereby declare that a national emergency exists, which makes it imperative that this ordinance shall become effective forthwith, the nature of said emergency being as follows: A State of war exists between the United States of America and Japan, Germany, and Italy, and the President of the United States has d clared that an invasion or predatory incursion is threatened, and it is necessary in the furtherance of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of this city that this ordinance be effective immediately.
