necessary in order to protect life or property during a blackout or air raid the police or the special police authorized herein, are authorized and directed to enter upon any premises within the city of Polson, using reasonable force, and to extinguish lights or take other necessary action to make effective any order, rule or regulation promulgated under the authority conferred by this ordinance.

Section 8. Conflicting Ordinances, Orders, Rules and Regulations Suspended. At all times when the orders, rules and regulations made and promulgated pursuant to this ordinance shall be in effect, they shall supercede all existing ordinances, orders, rules and regulations insofar as the latter may be inconsistent therewith.

Section 9. No Conflict With State or Federal Statutes. This ordinance shall not be construed so as to conflict with any State or Federal statute or with any military or naval order, rule or regulation.

Section 10. Penalties for Violations. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance or any order, rule or regulation issued pursuant thereto shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) or imprisonment for not more than Ninety (90) days.

Section 11. Separability of Provisions. It is the intention of the City Council that each separate provision of this ordinance shall be deemed independent of all other provisions herein, and it is further the intention of the city council that if a provision of this ordinance be declared to be invalid, all other provisions thereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

Section 12. Finding of Emergency. This ordinance is passed as an emergency measure, and the council does by the vote by which this ordinance is passed, hereby declare that a national emergency exists, which makes it imperative that this ordinance shall become effective forthwith, the nature of said emergency being as follows: A State of war exists between the United States of America and Japan, Germany, and Italy, and the President of the United States has declared that an invasion or predatory incursion is threatened, and it is necessary in the furtherance of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of this city that this ordinance be effective immediately.

ORDINANCE NO 208

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE 189 REGULATING AND FIXING THE SALARIES OF CERTAIN OF THE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF POLSON, MONTANA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF POLSON, MONTANA.

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance 189 be amended to read as follows:- The compensation of the City Clerk, Water and Street Commissioner, Ass't Street Commissioner, Police, Fire Chief and common labor employees is hereby fixed and established at the following named salaries; and that the same shall be accepted and taken as full compensation for all services to be rendered by said officers and employees of the city of Polson:-

City Clerk and Ass't Water Commissioner	per month	145.00
Street and Water Commissioner	"	170.00
Ass't Street Commissioner	"	135.00
Police (with \$10.00 gas allowance	"	135.00
Fire Chief	"	15.00
Common labor	55 cents per hour	

Street Commissioner, Ass't Street Commissioner and Fire Chief to be delegated police authority.

Section 2. The said several salaries shall be paid at the end of each month by the order of the city council and approval of the mayor.

Section 3. Where as an emergency exists and it is necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the public, this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

Passed by the council and approved by the mayor this 3rd day of May, 1943.
